

Supplies for 6 placemats based on a scrappy look with no ¼” seams to sew. Side A shows a place setting with plate, cup and silverware. Side B shows basic shapes, such as oval, triangle and circle. To complete this project as shown, your sewing machine needs to have the ability to sew some fancy stitches. Please read all the instructions before beginning. The blocks are cut a little larger than needed and will be trimmed before piecing. It is a quilt-as-you-go style design.

#### Fabric and batting:

- 6 different pieces, 12 ½” x 12 ½” for side A piecing
- 6 different pieces, 12 1/2” x 12 ½” for side B piecing (these can be the same or different than for Side A)
- 12 pieces, 12 ½” x 4”, for placemat sides – side A
- 12 pieces, 12 ½” x 4”, for placemat sides – side B (these can be the same or different than for Side A)
- 6 different pieces, 12” square for plates
- 6 different pieces, 7” square for plate centers
- 6 different pieces, 4” square for cups
- 18 pieces of at least 3 different fabrics, 3” x 11” for silverware
- 30 pieces (or more) 7” x 7” or larger for back appliqué shapes for Side B
- ½ yard of fabric for binding, cut at least 9 - 1” strips
- Crib / baby sized batting, cut into 12 - 12 ½” x 4” pieces, and 6 - 12 ½” x 12 ½” pieces

#### Threads:

Assorted rayon, polyester and metallic embroidery threads work well, but don't be afraid to personalize it with anything else you like – just remember that if you are going to use them, they will eventually need to be washed. Also, since both sides will be seen, you will need to be aware of the thread in the bobbin as well as the thread in the needle. Don't use a rough metallic in the bobbin and needle at the same time as you will only be asking for trouble.

#### Other supplies:

- KK2000 or quilt basting spray
- Template material
- **Rotary cutter, ruler (at least 18” long), and mat**
- **Scissors for cutting shapes**
- **Quilting gloves or discs to help you maneuver the quilt pieces**
