

# Sunflower Garden

Supplies are based on a scrappy look with no ¼” seams to sew. To complete this project as shown, your sewing machine needs to have the ability to sew some fancy stitches.

Fabric and batting:

- 12 different pieces, 7” square for ground
- 12 different pieces, 7” square for sky
- 24 different pieces, 6” square for flowers
- 24 different pieces, 4” square for flower centers
- 24 same or different pieces, 7” square for backing
- 24 7” squares “Warm and Natural” or similar batting (crib should be large enough)
- 1/2 yard fabric for binding and hanging sleeve

Threads:

Assorted rayon, polyester and metallic embroidery threads work well, but don't be afraid to personalize it with anything else you like.

Other supplies:

- Sewing machine in good working order – cleaned and oiled.
- Extra bobbins for your machine
- KK2000 or quilt basting spray
- Template material
- Rotary cutter, ruler (at least 18” long), and mat
- Scissors for cutting shapes
- Quilting discs or gloves to help you maneuver the quilt pieces
